From 1901 until 1928 the Headmaster was Mr Goronwy Richard Protheroe. He was also the church organist and choirmaster at St Margaret's Church and he is commemorated by a plaque on the north wall of the church.

In 1925 there were four classes and an HMI, visiting the school on 1st December, wrote the following:
"Five children from the school have obtained scholarships during the last two years. The work, however, as a whole, is uneven and much of it is capable of improvement. The senior children do not read well, nor do they exert themselves sufficiently, to understand the subject mattermuch of the work is marred by poor spelling."

In the 1920's the infants were taught in the south room and standards II, III and IV occupied the middle room which was later divided and is nowadays used as a library and classroom.

The logbook entry for 15th February 1928 contains the following interesting note: "A meeting of mothers of the children was held in the staff room for the purpose of discussing the establishment of a school canteen."



(Gardening Class 1927)
